1. Introduction:-

The Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt of India has formulated a scheme namely "Support for Marginalized Individuals for Livelihood & Enterprise (SMILE)" which includes sub-scheme "COMPREHENSIVE REHABILITATION OF PERSONS ENGAGED IN THE ACT OF BEGGING", which carries the objective to make the country 'Bhiksha Vritti Mukh' through several comprehensive measures consisting of welfare measures for persons engaged in begging with focus extensively on rehabilitation, provision of medical facilities, counselling, education, skill development through an effective convergence approach for their sustainable development. Ministry has identified 100 new cities covering major religious towns, tourist cities & other important places from 29 states & 3 UTs for implementation of the scheme and Koraput is one of the identified cities. Under this endeavour, the District Administration, Koraput intends to utilize the services of a Programme implementing agency/NGO to operate and manage a Beggars rehabilitation centre for implementation of the scheme.

2. Objectives:-

- To make the country 'Bhiksha Vritti Mukh' by adapting a strategy for comprehensive rehabilitation of persons engaged in begging through coordinated action & convergence with various stakeholders such as Central & State Govt, District Administration, Urban local bodies/ Municipal Offices and other stakeholders working in the field for welfare of destitute.
- To ensure the beggars reintegration in the mainstream of society to lead a life with dignity and self-confidence.
- To create an enabling environment to ensure equal opportunities, equity, social justice and empowerment of persons in destitution.
- To strengthen the existing implementation machinery and create facilities for coverage of all uncovered areas of the state for ensuring complete coverage of persons in destitution.

3. Components admissible for assistance under the sub-scheme: -

The below 4 components are mutually inclusive and indicative. Any stockholders may include any sub-component to suit their local requirements. However, all these four components have to be necessarily covered. Below are the suggested component-wise activities to be undertaken by the stakeholders:

4. Scope of Work:-

- a. The rehabilitation centre shall accommodate 50 inmates.**
- b. The agency shall be responsible for the following: -**
 - i. To set up the rehabilitation centre at Koraput city.

- ii. To run the day-to-day operation & management of rehabilitation centre for beggars of Koraput District.
- iii. To survey & identify the persons engaged in begging and all details of the persons to be kept in the survey format prescribed by the Govt of India (enclosed below).
- iv. To conduct rescue operation for persons engaged in the act of begging at road side/near temples/bus stands/ railway stations/ markets etc of Koraput area and rehabilitate them at the centre.
- v. To provide proper training to the persons who are engaged in the mobilization activity.
- vi. To liaise with the Police, local PRI member, municipal authority and District administration during survey/identification/rehabilitation.
- vii. To provide living space for the inmates (at least 60 sq ft per person) at the centre.
- viii. To provide facilities such as Electricity, telephone, water supply, bed, clothing, mosquito net, bed sheet, blanket & pillow, fan & light, CCTV, water purifier, toilet with proper cleanliness and other basic hygiene facilities. Maintenance such as cleaning/replacing/repair of the above services should be done regularly.
- ix. To provide nutritious food four times a day (including breakfast, lunch, snacks and dinner).
- x. To ensure proper space & cleanliness in the kitchen and there should be a dining room for 70-80 persons to dine at a time.
- xi. After mobilization to the shelter homes, all the residents shall be registered and an identity card containing their name, age (approx, if correct age is not available), address of the shelter home and state of health (normal/disabled etc.) shall be issued by the concerned agency. All such details have to be compulsorily filled in on the online Central Portal.
- xii. Shelter homes will facilitate all legally identified (Indian citizens) persons who are engaged in the act of begging for getting the necessary government documents such as Aadhaar, Ration card, BPL card etc. The beneficiaries should also be educated, sensitized and provided necessary assistance to avail benefits of different schemes/services provided by the state/UT and central government.
- xiii. There should be at least 600 sq ft hall area for activities and skill training for the inmates at the rehabilitation centre with a capacity of 100 inmates.
- xiv. These shelter homes will provide counselling support to the beneficiaries and motivate and encourage them to come out of begging and at the same time provide various health care services to the residents. Follow up should be made with the beggars so that they shall not return to the act of begging.
- xv. Any residents requiring a de-addiction facility shall be referred to De-addiction Treatment Centre in Hospitals or to an Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts (IRCAs) for detoxification and Whole Person Recovery.

- xvi. Some means of recreation activities such as television, music, games etc. will also be provided to the residents to make use of their time productively.
- xvii. The center should be properly ventilated, well-lit and maintained in a clean manner.
- xviii. Safety of the beneficiaries and their resident families, especially of women should be ensured.
- xix. Cubicles/rooms for consultation for physical examination and facilities with privacy for providing individual counselling, group therapy, re-educative sessions, family classes, etc. should be made available.
- xx. Computerization and maintaining soft copy of all the records is mandatory.
- xxi. Information pamphlets, handouts and other educational materials (IEC) in the vernacular language be made freely available for the public.

c. Comprehensive re-settlement: -

The shelter home/rehabilitation centre will facilitate for education for child engaged in the act of Begging and children of persons engaged in the act of Begging, skill development/vocational training to able-bodied persons as per their capacity, capability and desirability so that they can sustain and live a life of dignity by engaging in self-employment or wage employment and linkage to market.

- **Education:**-Shelter home shall facilitate education for children engaged in the act of Begging and children of persons engaged in the act of Begging by registering and enrolling them with the government schools under Samagrah Shiksha scheme of Ministry of Education. The home shall take the following steps to provide holistic education:
 - i. Mapping of the shelter home with the nearest government run educational institutions and subsequent linkage of the beneficiaries of the shelter home with these educational institutions.
 - ii. Shelter home shall reach out to the nearby government and low-cost private schools and admit children under Right to Education where all expenses of books, uniforms, school activities, etc. shall be taken care of under relevant provisions of the RTE Act.
 - iii. After school hours, provision for assistance in studies and homework shall also be provided. District administration running the shelter home should call for volunteers from school/colleges/nearby places and give them a certificate for successfully helping the children in their studies and homework for at least one month. NSS, NCC, NYV volunteers can be roped in and they shall act as a mentor for these children. Bridge Course Coordinator will help the children with their homework and support them in achieving grade-level competency.

- **Skill development:-** The shelter home will also facilitate in providing counseling and skill development training to the able-bodied beneficiaries who are above 18 years of age as per their capacity, capability and desirability in order to improve their life skill and socio-economic conditions. This will enable them to start income generating activities on their own or get gainfully employed in some sector or the other.
 - i. Shelter Home shall identify and network with government recognized vocational centres to refer persons for training.
 - ii. Skill component may be covered under the component of PM-DAKSH. Linkage has been made to this effect. In regard to some small/petty type occupational training (cleaning job, hair cutting, house work, etc.) the implementing agency will use locally available resource.
 - iii. Private players can be roped in for providing skill development training.
 - iv. Culturally relevant vocational training to be considered, utilizing local resources and the marketability of the products - e.g. candle making, tailoring, carpentry and mat weaving. Their talent (singing, dance, arts) can also be identified and shelter home should try to provide them with a platform where they can showcase their art skills and earn livelihood.
- **Health:-** The shelter home will facilitate healthcare services to the beneficiaries as per requirement i.e. medical checkup, medical tests and further treatment through Government run clinics and hospitals etc. The following steps may be considered for
 - i. Primary hygiene of the beneficiary should be ensured immediately on the entry of the person into the centre.
 - ii. An initial health checkup will be done by a medical professional once the beneficiary enters the shelter home premises for the first time.
 - iii. Regular medical checkups/camps will be conducted through Govt. hospitals or specialty / referral hospitals in case a serious medical condition is found.
 - iv. After their government documents are made, they may be linked to the government scheme for medical aid and insurance (PMJAY) and National rural health mission and National Urban health mission for Rashtriya Swasthya Bima Yojana etc.

d. Agency shall maintain the following records.

e. Publicity of information:-

In order to ensure information on availability of the beggars rehabilitation centre to the targeted population, adequate publicity measures should be taken on regular basis. The rehabilitation centre should display the information through hoardings/posters at main points like railway station, bus stand, hospital, park, market areas etc.

5. Funding of Agency: -

- a) For fulfillment of the scope of work mentioned above, fund shall be sanctioned to the agency as per the funding pattern approved under SMILE Scheme by the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, GoI.**

6. Minimum Eligibility Criteria:-

- Applicants eligible for participating in the assignment should be a single legal entity registered in India. The institutions should be registered under the Indian Societies Act, 1860 or the Indian Trusts Act, 1882 or Section 8 of the Companies Act, 2013 or any other appropriate Act as may be notified by the Government of India/Odisha from time to time, for at least 3 years as on 31st March 2025.
- The Applicant should have a minimum average annual turnover of Rs.50 lakhs over the last three years. (Documents required – Audited financial statement, Balance Sheet, IT Returns of last 3 years)
- The agency should be registered under Section 139A & 12AA of the Income tax Act, 1961.
- Should be registered under PAN, NGO DARPAN PORTAL.
- Should have at least 3 years of working experience in management of rehabilitation centres for destitute/beggars/disabled persons/child care institutions/Old aged persons or any other residential setups in related fields with minimum 50 Nos of inmates.(Documents required- Work orders/completion certificates of the assignments)
- Should not have any track record of contract termination of previous assignments of Govt or any adverse report on performance or blacklisted by Central/State Govt. (Documents required- Undertaking in a non-judicial stamp paper)
- Must have qualified professionals with expertise in handling people with disability, Old aged persons, Destitute persons, Beggars and have experience & expertise in physiotherapy, social work, health care, etc.
- Should not discriminate against any person or group of persons on the grounds of sex, religion, caste, creed or disability.

7. Duration of work: -

The initial period of contract shall be 1 year from the date of award of the contract. However, it can be extended based on the performance of the selected agency. The District Administration shall form an 'Evaluation & Monitoring Committee' which will regularly supervise and assess the performance of the selected agency.

8. Payment Terms for Agency/Institution:-

Penalty, to be decided by the Collector, shall be deducted, if beggars found begging at Koraput city and come to the notice of District administration.

9. Instruction to Applicants for submission of the Request For Proposal:-

- The RFP document can be downloaded from the website <https://koraput.odisha.gov.in>.
- The applicants are invited to submit proposal as per the given formats in separate sealed covers for the services required for the assignment. All format mentioned in the Annexure (enclosed below) shall be duly filled up.
- Applicants are advised to study all instruction, forms, terms & requirement and other information in the RFP documents carefully. Submission of bid shall be deemed to have been done after careful examination & analysis of the RFP document with full understanding of its implications. The response to this RFP should be full and complete in all respects. Failure to furnish required information as mentioned in the RFP or submission of a proposal not substantially responsive to the RFP documents in every respect will be at the applicant's risk and may result in rejection of their proposal.
- The proposal should be submitted along with a refundable EMD of Rs.60,000/- (Rs. Sixty thousand) only in the form of DD drawn from a scheduled commercial bank in favour of District Social Security Officer, Koraput.
- The applicant is responsible for all costs incurred in connection with participation in this process, including, but not limited to costs incurred in the conduct of informative and other diligence activities, participation in meetings/discussions/presentations, preparation of its application, in providing any additional information required by this Office to facilitate the application process. This Office will in no case be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct of outcome of the bidding process. All material submitted by the applicant shall become the property of this Office.
- The proposals to be submitted by the bidders should be firm and valid for a period of 90days from the last date of submission of the proposal.
- Bidders may request clarifications on the RFP document within the scheduled date & time mentioned in this RFP.
- Any request for clarification must be sent in writing, or by Email.
- The cost of each Bid Document is Rs.4000/- plus applicable GST of 18% i.e.Rs.4720/-(Four thousand seven hundred twenty) only in the form of DD drawn from a commercial scheduled bank in favour of District Social Security Officer, Koraput, which is not refundable.
- The successful bidder should submit performance security fee of Rs.1,50,000/- (Rs. One lakh fifty thousand) only at the time of execution.
- The applications must reach on or before the date & time as specified in Page No.2 of this RFP. This Office won't be responsible for postal delays.

- At any time before the submission of proposals, this Office may amend the RFP by issuing an addendum/corrigendum. The addendum/corrigendum shall be a part of the original RFP and shall be uploaded in the website <https://koraput.odisha.gov.in>.
- The application including supporting documents shall be typed or written in indelible ink and the applicant shall initial each page. Any alteration, omissions, additions or any other amendments made in the application shall be initialled by the applicant or Authorized signatory of the applicant. The applicant should fill in information in prescribed formats for qualification as mentioned in the RFP. The applicants shall submit all supporting documents in the format as prescribed in the RFP along with suggested documentary evidence with the application.
- In absence of bidders, an authorized representative of the bidders shall initial all pages of the proposals. The authorization shall be in the form of a written power of attorney accompanying the proposal or in any other form demonstrating that the representative has been duly authorized to sign.

10. Submission Proposal:-(A)

11. Evaluation & Selection:-

One committee for evaluation of Bids and selection of agency shall be formed. Initial bid scrutiny will be made and incomplete details as given below will be treated as non-responsive, if proposals are-

- Not submitted as specified in the RFP document.


21. Signing of Contract:-
